Minimum

The PPD minimum rate is the same as the TTD minimum rate.

Although every attempt is made to calculate the workers' compensation rates in an accurate and reliable manner, only the Illinois statute governs. Where there is a disagreement between the statute and the IWCC's calculations, the statute is correct.

* As provided in Section 8(b)4, there is no increase in the benefit rates for 1/15/10 - 7/14/10 because the FY SAWW decreased.

** As provided in Section 8(b)4, there is no increase in the benefit rates for 7/15/10 - 1/14/11 because the CY SAWW decreased.

*** As provided in Section 8(b)4, there is no increase in the benefit rates for 1/15/11 - 7/14/11 because there was no increase in SAWW since 7/15/09-1/14/11.

*The State minimum wage was increased to \$8.25 effective July 1, 2010.
